Choice of Law

Presented by

Jonathan Gregory, Esq.

Professor Jonathan Gregory who had obtained his J.D. from the University of California, Los Angeles in 2001 has taught Choice of Law at San Francisco Law School since 2007. He is an attorney in private practice specializing in interstate business, insurance and real estate matters. His representative work in the subject matter of this course includes *Tenney v. State Farm* 2008 WL 2561156 (E.D.Cal., 2008), a case involving a choice-of-law dispute over underinsured motorist benefits. Prof. Gregory secured summary judgment in favor of the insurer after persuading the court to apply California law to an out-of-state accident.

This elective concerns the choice-of-law problems that often arise in civil litigation, particularly in interstate disputes. Lawsuits often involve more than one state, meaning that one or more of the underlying events occurred outside the forum state, or one or more of the parties is a nonresident. In these types of cases, conflicts frequently arise over which state laws should apply. Choice-of-law
